Module Description	Students do a critical in-depth analysis of a current business trend (e.g., digitization or sustainability), evaluating related development options thoroughly and deriving sound recommendations. They employ and integrate a wide range of competencies (e.g., professional, methodological, social, and self-competence). In a paper, students discuss various concepts and frameworks, documenting and reflecting on chosen methods and sources. Students present their findings in the form of a poster in a convincing, illustrative manner that takes into account their target audience. Students organize their group work to achieve an integrated result that goes beyond the copying/pasting of single group member contributions. In this module, students have the opportunity to practice important skills in preparation for their Bachelor's thesis.
