<b>Module Description</b>	The "ProARIS II" elective follows on from the "ProARIS" elective module offered in the fall semester. In the "ProARIS" electives, students have the opportunity to expand their practical experience in the ARIS project in business management functions (project management, marketing, HR). The Swiss Academic Space Initiative ARIS (Akademische Raumfahrt Initiative Schweiz, <a href="https://aris-space.ch">https://aris-space.ch</a> ) was founded by students at ETH Zurich in 2017 as an association with the aim (and support of ETH Zurich) of getting the next generation excited about space travel, enabling students to work in interdisciplinary teams on practical team projects, and ultimately to build a rocket every year to take part in an international competition between universities in the United States (Spaceport America Cups (SPAC)) in June. Students are supported and coached by SML lecturers.
