Module Description	The Business Administration Skills module deals with the topics of "academic writing" and "project management". In addition to subject-specific skills in these areas, interdisciplinary skills (methodological, social and personal skills) are also promoted, which are required to successfully complete a degree program (e.g. working successfully in groups). To this end, (indepth) fundamentals are taught and developed by the students. Performance is assessed during the semester by means of three different assessments: In group work, a disposition (written performance assessment 1) and a project management plan in the form of a slide doc (written performance assessment 2) are created. The third (individual) assessment - the skills quest - consists of various tasks that students can complete. Successfully completed tasks lead to points that are converted into a grade at the end of the semester.
