Module Description	Students do a critical in-depth analysis of a current business trend (e.g., digitization or sustainability), evaluating related development options thoroughly and deriving sound recommendations. They employ and integrate a wide range of competencies (professional, methodological, social, and self-competence). In a paper, students discuss various concepts and frameworks, documenting and reflecting on the methods and sources they have chosen. Students present their findings verbally in a poster session that is detailed, compelling, and descriptive, taking into account their target audience. Students also do a group project and present their results as an integrated team effort rather than the copying/pasting of the contributions of individual group members. In this module, students have the opportunity to practice important skills in preparation for writing a Bachelor's thesis.
