Module Description	In international matters, private international law provides answers as to which country a suit can be brought in and which national law applies. The aim of this module is to provide students with the basic knowledge of private international law. Students learn how to determine international jurisdiction in the Lugano Convention area and how to determine local jurisdiction and applicable law by means of the IPRG. Furthermore, students learn how foreign judgments under the Lugano Convention and the ICCPR can be recognized and enforced in a state.
