Module Description	One of the key functions of management is dealing with risk - the possibility of events not unfolding as planned and negatively impacting the business. This module builds on the experience of dealing with disasters to understand the nature of risk and how individuals, teams, and organizations fail to recognize and manage it. It investigates typical business risks such as new product introduction and cyber. Finally, it discusses the frameworks that have been developed to effectively manage these risks. Instruction is exclusively case-based, with theoretical content introduced over time to more effectively analyze and discuss the cases. Students apply the insights gained in a group project.
